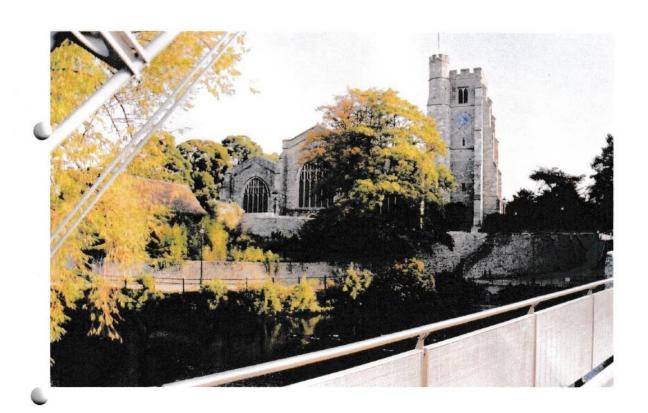

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## **INTRODUCTION TO THE REPORTS 2003**

I have great pleasure in introducing and commending the Annual Reports of our parish for 2003. They represent a great deal of work by many people and I am grateful for all those who, in so many and varied ways, contribute to the work of our parish and the mission of the Church both locally and in the wider community. Here I can only highlight a few things.

2003 was a busy year building on our earlier pattern of things. We had several more joint Parish Eucharist's than in previous years; this is always a difficult matter balancing the advantages of the joint service with changing the pattern people are used to. Overall I trust they were good and helped somewhat the cohesion of our diverse parish. I commend the faithfulness of worshippers at all three of our churches. It is good to see the way St Stephen's is slowly but steadily developing. Elizabeth Bussmann has started good new initiatives in the Prayer & Praise on the evening of the last Sunday of the month, Parish Prayer on the 2nd & 4th Wednesdays of the month, Seedlings for Parents and little children on Tuesday afternoons, all at St Philip's and with an afternoon school club at All Saints School.

Finance and buildings continue to dominate our agenda. We undertook major works to the north aisles of All Saints and are spending about £20,000 on work urgently needed through our architects 5 yearly inspection. This will use up most of our funds. We start again finding money for the south choir aisle roofs which we hope to start late 2004 or early 2005. While St Philip's inspection revealed no urgent matters, there is a certain amount to be done in the next five years, mostly on lower level stone work. We hope this may be combined with improvements to the St. Philip's Church Centre. We need to find more users for the centre so it becomes self financing again. In all of this work very grateful to all who have worked so hard and been so generous in giving and raising funds.

Our Church Schools continue to develop their work as well as grow closer to the parish. I am sure than in the years ahead we shall discover the centrality of our church school to the life and mission of our parish. While our regular giving is has increased by about 4 1/2% over each of the last two years which is very good. It is still well below what we need. For the fifth year running we have been unable to pay our quota in full and there are several matters it would be good to be able to spend money on. I have experienced very great pressure from the diocesan authorities and the deanery to contribute what they consider to be our parish share; all of which I find difficult.

Space does not allow me to mention by name all who help so much in our parish. Brian Neaves, completing his 7th year as Churchwarden, contributes an enormous amount in helping keep All Saints orderly and in good condition and in his music at St Philip's and both church schools and far more. I do worry that we are expecting too much of all our wardens and a few other people and need to find ways of sharing tasks more. I was very grateful for all Suzanne Payne did in the parish office until she left to take on new work in November. Christopher Payne does so much as our Treasurer. Lionel Marchant continues to do much both with music and money. My colleagues Priscilla and Elizabeth contribute greatly to our parish work

2004 brings us further challenges, the whole Church of England faces great pressures to change its structures both for financial reasons and to make work more effective in this rapidly changing world. What never changes is God call, to each of us, to gather every Sunday and Holy Day to listen to God's Word and Break Bread together. May God continue to guide and bless all we do in his name.

## Meetings of the Parochial Church Council

The members of the PCC met for five Ordinary Meetings in the year of 2003. There was an average of 81% attendance.

The main discussions again this year of the PCC were the Restoration of All Saints and the Tower completion at St Philips Church and Centre. Finance was also a regular discussion.

#### All Saints Church

As in past years there was much discussion regarding the restoration of the church and the applications for funding.

Work to the North Aisle and the Holy Name Chapel has been completed.

Specifications will shortly be drawn up for the work to the South Aisles and funding will be actively sought.

The church clock is slowly disintegrating and is not now working at all. Estimates have been received for repairs.

The Quinquennial inspection was carried out during the year resulting in a number of minor repairs.

The war memorial was fenced off due to its unsafe condition

Concern was raised regarding rats in the churchyard and also in the church.

PAYE have repaired the church wall.

### St Philips Church

Future works at St Philips were given consideration and a meeting was held in January to discuss proposals. Plans were made for a Trust Funds for St Philips Church and the Centre and a draft was drawn up and approved by the PCC.

Various repairs were undertaken during the year as a result of the Quinquennial inspection.

#### **Finance**

Accounts were presented and discussed at every meeting. The quota payable to the Diocese is continuing to cause some concern as the church is still unable to pay the full sum each year.

Health and Safety

This is now an agenda item at every PCC meeting and the church has to draw up and adopt a Health and Safety Policy with a Health and Safety Officer being appointed for each church. Health and Safety issues are discussed at every PCC meeting and the appropriate action put in hand.

Security

This was again another regular agenda item as the new Insurers are more particular over certain areas of security.

**Maidstone Deanery** 

Reports from the Maidstone Deanery were regularly circulated to members.

A Deanery Mission Plan has recently been issued and circulated to members of the PCC.

#### Services at both All Saints and St Philips

Christmas and Joint Services were reviewed regularly.

**Anglican Methodist Covenant** 

The Methodists have now agreed to proceed with this proposed and a meeting was held in York in July to discuss the way forward.

#### Licenses

The law regarding alcohol is to be more forcefully enforced so it was decided to appoint a co-ordinator so that a multiple application could be made for a license.

## REPORT of the CHURCHWARDENS on the FABRIC of ALL SAINTS CHURCH and St. PHILIP'S CHURCH

#### ALL SAINTS CHURCH

The restoration of the roofs in the North aisle and Holy Name Chapel is nearing completion. Considerable amount of roof timbers required replacing.

The Regimental Standards were removed to enable the scaffolding to be erected for the work to be carried out. The Standards will be re-hung when the scaffolding is removed.

The repairs highlighted in the last Quinquennial report will be commenced shortly. Minor repairs have been made to the heating grills, the broken cement on the floor and some electrical repairs.

The clearance of the gulleys and drains some, which required professional attention, have been carried out.

An estimate is awaited for the repairs to the chiming mechanism of the Church clock.

Thanks to the friendly loyal band of volunteers who keep the interior of the church building clean and for carrying out minor repairs.

#### St. PHILIP'S CHURCH

The Quinquennial report was received in 2003 and discussions continue to take place on its contents. A congregational Meeting has been scheduled to take place on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> January 2004 to put forward their views and discuss ideas for the future of the Centre. Mr Mathew Woodham is drawing up feasibility plans, which could help make the Centre more user friendly. Our thanks to Miss Janice Underdown for her involvement in this work. The proposals from the meeting will be discussed by the Centre Committee who will prioritise the work and make recommendations to the PCC.

The Hall was decorated during the school holiday period at Easter and this included additional wood penelling where new heaters had been fitted as well as replacing badly damaged floor tiles both in the hall and to the entrance to the Coffee Bar. At this time the hall curtains were taken down, cleaned and refitted.

In the Coffee Bar the foam plastic chairs were removed to comply with instructions from our insurance company and there is now a need to replace them.

Carpets at the altar and in the Coffee Bar were cleaned and repaired.

The main Notice Board outside the church has been repaired extensively and re-painted

A pin board focussing on Prayer has been put up. Delete as this was 2004.

During the year routine cleaning of the church continues to be undertaken by volunteers under the leadership of Hilary Eastgate as well as the two 'Big Cleans' and we are most grateful for all involved. Routine maintenance has also continued to be carried out thanks to the efforts of Ken Bridges and again we are most grateful for this largely unsung work.

An updating of the Church sound system has been installed by Ian Hope which allows greater flexibility in the use of the microphones, CD player and cassette deck. All this from the back of the church where it is fitted in a new cabinet thanks to work by Jobey Grey.

## FINANCIAL STATEMENT

2003 has been another difficult year for our parish in financial terms. For the fifth year running we have been unable to pay our Parish Share in full and our reserves have fallen again. There is some good news however. Our giving has increased by over 4% for the second successive year and we have paid more Parish Share this year than ever before £34,738 (2002 – £26,887). We have managed to reduce our insurance outgoing by changing our insurance company which has in turn helped to lower the church running costs (heat, light, cleaning & insurance) of both churches to a combined £297 per week (2002 - £410).

However the total costs of our parish exceeded our income by £19,969 (2002 - £16582). This means that despite all the good news above, our combined parish shortfall is a staggering £384 per week (2002 - £319) This year our Parish Share increase has been restricted to less than £200 but it still means that out of a total income of approx. £75,000, two-thirds is spent paying the parish share.

The accounts are prepared on the accruals basis. This means they show the position if all income had been received and all expenditure paid by the end of the year. Detailed debtors & creditors arising from this are on page 24.

#### **BALANCE SHEET page 16**

The Balance Sheet is a summary of the Parish's net assets. The net assets at 31 December 2003 stood at £46,658 (2002 £59,488). Our net assets have fallen because of losses on the ordinary accounts of All Saints and St Philip (page 18) and to a lesser degree St Philip Centre and All Saints Bellringers (page 19).

#### All Saints with St Philip Ordinary Account

Planned Giving has increased by 4.4% from £49,222 in 2002 to £51,403. Once again this is a tremendous effort by the Parish particularly in light of continued fund raising for the two buildings. Sundry donations at

All Saints showed an increase thanks to a donation from the Majewski family.

The biggest increases in resources used are the Parish Share, up by £8.868, and Other up by £2,014. This includes the cost of the Quinquennial report for St Philips and vestments and a chalice purchased out of the Majewski donation for All Saints. There were however substantial reductions of expenditure made in several areas particularly Minibus, Upkeep of services, Printing, Bank Charges & as already mentioned Church Running expenses.

In summary All Saints had a deficit of £10,408 in 2003 and St. Philip £9,561.

### All Saints with St Philip Extra Ordinary Account

This account continues to be used for income and expenditure of a one off nature. It also includes the amount raised in 2003 specifically for St Philips Future Fund.

## STATEMENT of FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES Other Unrestricted Funds page 19

Fee Account - This is a clearing account for monies received and paid under the headings shown.

**Community Account** – The figures show a small surplus of £353 for the Parish magazine.

St. Philip Centre – The Centre has made a loss of £2,637 this year due in part to repairs to the flat roof over the West porch and increases in cleaning and heating bills.

All Saints Church Shop – The shop was able to make a very welcome contribution of £550 to parish funds.

All Saints Bellringers – The accounts show a loss of £2,731 for the society.

The remaining funds (Organ & Choir, Legacy, Fabric and Minibus) on this page are controlled by the PCC and show the movement in the year.

#### STATEMENT of FINANCIAL AFFAIRS - Restricted Funds page 20

These are all small investments held by the Canterbury Board of Finance (CBF) and the Official Custodian for Charities. All income deriving from these funds is expended as shown.

#### ANNUAL REPORT

#### PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCILS' RESPONSIBILITIES

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Council and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregulariti

## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL OF:

## ALL SAINTS WITH ST PHILIP, MAIDSTONE for year ended 31st DECEMBER 2003

We have audited the financial statements of the Parochial Church Council of All Saints with St Philip, Maidstone for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2003 on pages 16 to 24. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out therein.

## RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL AND AUDITORS

The Parochial Church Councils' responsibilities for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards are set out in the Statement of Parochial Church Councils' Responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the

Annual Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the Parochial Church Council has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding trustees' remuneration and transactions with the company is not disclosed.

We read the Annual Report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

#### BASIS OF AUDIT OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Parochial Church Council in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Councils circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which vectoriside in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. However, the evidence available to us was limited because the Council derives a substantial proportion of its income from voluntary donations which cannot be fully controlled until they are entered in the accounting records, and are therefore not susceptible to independent audit verification.

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

## QUALIFIED OPINION ARISING FROM LIMITATION IN AUDIT SCOPE

Except for any adjustments that might have been found to be necessary had we been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning the completeness of voluntary donations. In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the Parochial Church Councils' affairs as at 31<sup>st</sup> December 2003 and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure in the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and Charities Act 1993.
