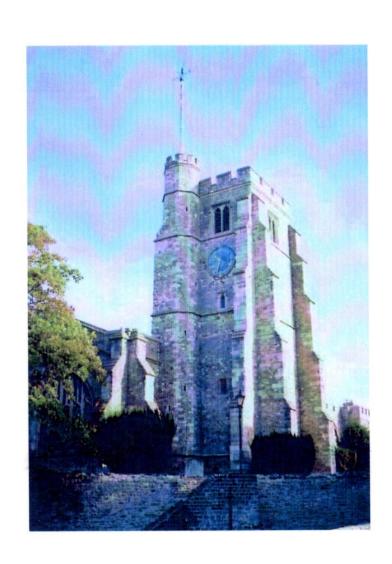

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### **INTRODUCTION TO THE REPORTS 2004**

Movement towards our new church school has continued its snail like progress. Many members of our congregation have a valued role in our church schools: some as staff, some as voluntary helpers, others through the governing bodies. I would particularly like to thank Mollie Neaves for all the hard work she undertakes both for the present running of All Saints School and for the new school.

It is invidious to mention too many people by name and those I mention must stand as representatives for others. Our music in 2004 has depended very much on Peter and Sally Richards and Brian Neaves. Roger Doe pops up in many roles: reader. choir member, organist and server. David Freed not only cares for St Stephen's Congregation and is a governor of both church schools but somehow finds time to do the most wonderful flower arrangements and leads some aspects of our Advent and Lent clubs with great imagination and effect. Roger and Sue Manuell have been great workers at All Saints in many differing capacities. And the list could go on and on.

We need to strike that difficult balance between being proud of so much that is good in our life with a sense we could do better in some areas but not to feel burdened when we lack the resources to do all we would like. May God continue to bless us and guide us in the years ahead.

During the year Mr William Taylor resigned from the PCC due to ill health.

Meetings of the Parochial Church Council

The members of the PCC met for three Ordinary Meetings in the year of 2004 (with a further meeting planned for 14<sup>th</sup> April). There was an average of 61% attendance.

The main discussions again this year of the PCC were the Restoration of All Saints and the continuing improvements at St Phillips.

### St Philips Church

The Friends of St Philips is now an official charity

Some further repairs outstanding from the Quinquennial Report have been carried out.

Further improvements are required to meet the Disability Discrimination Act.

#### Finance

Accounts were presented and discussed at every meeting. The quota payable to the Diocese is continuing to give rise for concern but this year the income from All Saints is slightly increased and more of the quota has been paid.

Some savings have been made on expenditure.

The smaller charity accounts have been wound up with the monies being distributed between the All Saints Development and Restoration Fund, Friends of St Philip's Community Centre and the Youth Committee.

### Stewardship

The Stewardship Committee have met with the Diocesan Stewardship Advisor who will give a presentation at a joint service at St Philips on 13<sup>th</sup> March.

### Health and Safety

This is now an agenda item at every PCC meeting and issues are raised and acted upon.

### Security

This was again another regular agenda item.

### **Maidstone Deanery**

Two booklets were distributed namely the Maidstone Deanery Mission Plan and the Maidstone Deanery Mission and Ministry Review.

The Deanery Mission Plan was regularly discussed with concerns being taken back to the Deanery Pastora Committee.

### Services at both All Saints and St Philips

Christmas and Joint Services were reviewed regularly.

### **Amalgamation of Church Schools**

The PCC were regularly informed as to the progress of the amalgamation of All Saints School and Stephens School.

### REPORT of the CHURCHWARDENS on the FABRIC of ALL SAINTS CHURCH and St. PHILIP'S CHURCH

### ALL SAINTS CHURCH

During 2004 no restoration projects have been undertaken.

Work carried out has been as a result of the Quinnquennial inspection, with most items relating to lead work, guttering and water dispersal from the roofs.

Unfortunately, during the year, our major contractor for such work, Charles Walter Limited, ceased trading our architect is currently investigating alternative contractors.

Further restoration projects are planned, with the roofing to the choir aisle, vestry and organ chamber due to commence in the summer of 2005.

Work to the south porch gates is currently underway, with the removal of the wire netting and the installation of Perspex, which will improve visibility, security and reduce weather penetration.

Since the restoration of the most problematic lead work in recent years, water penetration has become less of a problem, although some leaks were seen after the recent heavy snowfall.

As most will be aware, a new sound system has been installed and is proving very successful, with improved audibility in all areas of the church, including the north porch, where the crèche meet

### St. PHILIP'S CHURCH

A new cooker with six burners and large oven was installed in the kitchen.

Our cleaning contractor carried out a spring clean in the porch area; removing all the cobwebs.

A broken pew in church was repaired.

Damaged steps and paving slabs by the Vestry door were replaced.

The Vestry door and doors within the Centre were treated or painted, as appropriate, inside and out.

The Friends of St Philip's Community Centre donated ten grey soft fabric easy chairs replacing the foam plastic ones in the Coffee Bar.

The cage in the west porch now holds equipment for the Seedlings group.

The first part of the proposed plans for new toilets, lift and entrance have been approved. We wait to be advised of the option priorities and to plan the way ahead.

Much needed updating of our electrical fuse boxes and lighting in the hall has been carried out. The hall now looks a lot brighter and welcoming. New regulation fire exit signs have been fitted above the West Porch door and Entrance.

We are grateful to all those people who anonymously carry out tasks both large and small to keep the fabric of the church in the best order possible.

### Mission and Outreach

The Coffee and Chat group continue to meet on every Tuesday morning throughout the year providing a welcome to everyone.

The annual Parish Holiday Weekend was again held at Eastbourne and was voted as being very enjoyable. The scope of the activities was wider with quizzes, 'Do It Yourself' entertainment, Line and Formation Dancing, singing by some of the cast of 'Joseph' and celebrating Harvest Festival at Holy Trinity Church in the town centre. It would be good if more people from the parish joined in the holiday next year.

The Parish Social Committee were not able to function as well as in previous years mainly due to a lack of volunteers from our sister churches. ### FINANCIAL STATEMENT

2004 has been an encouraging year for our parish from a financial point of view. True we are still making a deficit and unable to pay our Parish Share in full, but there are clear signs of an improvement over recent years. Our giving has increased over 2003 by 6.3% and once again we have paid more Parish Share this year than ever before £39,512 (2003 – £34,738). In addition we have managed to lower our expenditure by reducing our costs by over £4,000 in total.

However the total costs of our parish exceeded our income by £10,257 (2003 - £19,969). This means that despite all the good news above, our combined parish shortfall is still £197 per week (2003 - £384)

I am cautiously optimistic that these trends will continue in the right direction. The stewardship presentation in March 2005 was a very powerful one and I hope parishioners will respond accordingly.

The accounts are prepared on the accruals basis. This means they show the position if all income had been received and all expenditure paid by the end of the year. Detailed debtors & creditors arising from this are on page 23.

### **BALANCE SHEET page 15**

The Balance Sheet is a summary of the Parish's net assets. The net assets at 31 December 2004 stood at £48,522 (2003 £46,658). Our net assets have remained fairly static with losses on the ordinary accounts of All Saints and St Philip (page 17) offset by increases to the organ & choir fund and St Philip Centre (page 18).

This page represents the Parish Ordinary and Extra Ordinary income and expenditure items that are shown in more detail on pages 20 and 21.

### All Saints with St Philip Ordinary Account

I have already stated that Planned Giving in the Parish has increased by 6.3% over 2003. Whilst this is a good effort it hides the fact that all of this increase has come from All Saints whilst St Philip's planned giving has actually fallen. Church collections are virtually identical to 2003 whilst sundry donations reflect a contribution for filming in St Philip's church. I would also like to state that collections and giving from the congregation at St Stephens totalled £650, and only because of limitations in the presentation of these

accounts, this amount is included with All Saints income.

The only significant increase in resources used is Church Running expenses, up by 21%. This is almost entirely due to increases in heat & light costs at both churches and we need to review our current suppliers of gas and electricity. There were however substantial reductions of expenditure made in several areas particularly Minor repairs, Salaries & Printing. I have already spoken about the Parish Share above but it should be noted that our Deanery was able to contribute £2,000 in 2004 to our arrears for which we are very grateful.

### All Saints with St Philip Extra Ordinary Account

This account continues to be used for income and expenditure of a one off nature. It also includes the amount received from a legacy specifically for St Philips.

### STATEMENT of FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES Other Unrestricted Funds page 18

Fee Account - This is a clearing account for monies received and paid under the headings shown.

Community Account – The figures show a small surplus of £437 for the Parish magazine.

St. Philip Centre – The Centre has made a surplus of £1,857 this year due in part to no major repairs necessary in 2004.

All Saints Church Shop - The shop was unable to make a contribution to parish funds in 2004.

All Saints Bellringers – The accounts show a surplus of £548 for the society.

Mothers' Union – The accounts are included for the first time in 2004.

The remaining funds (Organ & Choir, Legacy, Fabric and Minibus) on this page are controlled by the PCC and show the movement in the year.

### STATEMENT of FINANCIAL AFFAIRS - Restricted Funds page 19

These are all small investments held by the Canterbury Board of Finance (CBF) and the Official Custodian for Charities. The PCC passed a resolution to dispose of most of these investments in 2004 and this was duly done as shown. All income deriving from these funds is expended as shown.

My thanks go to all those who work tirelessly behind the scenes banking and recording monies, keeping accurate records and ultimately helping to produce these accounts.

### ANNUAL REPORT

### PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCILS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the Parochial Church Council to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Council and of the income and expenditure of the Council for that year. In preparing those financial statements, the Parochial Church Council are required to:-

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,

- follow applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Council will continue in business.

The Parochial Church Council are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Council and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985, the Church Accounting Regulations 1997 to 2001 and the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Council and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL OF:

### ALL SAINTS WITH ST PHILIP, MAIDSTONE for year ended 31st DECEMBER 2004

We have audited the financial statements of the Parochial Church Council of All Saints with St Philip, Maidstone for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2004 on pages 15 to 23. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out therein.

### RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL AND AUDITORS

The Parochial Church Councils' responsibilities for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards are set out in the Statement of Parochial Church Councils' Responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the

Annual Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the Parochial Church Council has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding trustees' remuneration and transactions with the company is not disclosed.

We read the Annual Report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

### BASIS OF AUDIT OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Parochial Church Council in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Councils circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. However, the evidence available to us was limited because the Council derives a substantial proportion of its income from voluntary donations which cannot be fully controlled until they are entered in the accounting records, and are therefore not susceptible to independent audit verification.

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

### QUALIFIED OPINION ARISING FROM LIMITATION IN AUDIT SCOPE

Except for any adjustments that might have been found to be necessary had we been able to obtain sufficient evidence concerning the completeness of voluntary donations. In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the Parochial Church Councils' affairs as at 31st December 2004 and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure in the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and Charities Act 1993.
