A reflection on Mark 1:29-39

It would be hard to offer a reflection this week without the mention of Captain Tom. As his daughter remarked he could never have imagined that the last year of his life could be quite so remarkable. As the Archbishop of Canterbury put it, 'where he walked, a nation followed', and it sounds as though his efforts for the NHS charities were repaid several times over in the quality of care he received as his life came to a close.

This week's gospel is centred on the healing ministry of Jesus. It begins with a very personal encounter as he offers his healing touch to Peter's mother in law, but soon the whole town descends on him bringing their illness and disease to him for his attention. This is no coincidence for the writer of Mark's gospel because for him, Jesus' healing ministry is not just about the individual but about the whole community. Mark wants us to understand that God's Kingdom can only come when the dis-ease of poverty, injustice and oppression which afflicted the people of Palestine in those days are also healed.

I don't think we will gain anything from the example of Captain Tom if we create a statue in his memory. Rather, we need to emulate his example of 'living for the common good.' He reminded us that this pandemic touches us not just as individuals but as a nation, indeed as a global community because, as the scientists are quick to tell us, no one is safe until all are safe.

So, as we reflect on the healing ministry of Jesus today, we pray not just for the healing of each and everyone who is suffering, but also for the healing of the nations and for the eradication of all that keeps people from living life to the full.

God of all people, you sent your Son to bring healing and wholeness to our world. May his light bring hope to the sick in body and mind; to the broken, the persecuted, the dispossessed and the excluded, that we might feel the Kingdom drawing near and play our part in its fulfilment. Amen


