Collect

Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus revealed him to be your Son, anointing him with the Holy Spirit: grant to us, who are born again by water and the Spirit, that we may be faithful to our calling as your adopted children; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Reading Genesis 1:1-5

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

Gospel

Mark 1:4-11

John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair. with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.' In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved: with you I am well pleased.

Post Communion

An Epiphany Reflection

It's not very often that you hear the Queen talk explicitly about her Christian Faith but in her Christmas speech she was unequivocal, 'the teachings of Christ have served as my inner light.' It clearly drives who she is and the values she holds.

It was not an inner light that drew the wise men to the manger on that first Epiphany, but rather the star that shone in the East that drew them there.

However, when they arrived, it was no longer the star that shone in the East that held them there but the light of love, mercy and compassion that shone forth from the Christ child, so much so that their hearts and lives were changed forever. Instead of returning to the corrupt and violent rule of Herod, they turned their backs on him and returned to their own country to live, we might assume, a new and transformed life.

As we begin this New Year with another lockdown deprived of social contact and once again fearful for our own health and the health of those we love, how can we ensure that the inner light of Christ's love, hope and compassion continues to shine in and through us. Perhaps this prayer might help

Christ as a light illumine and guide me. Christ as a shield overshadow me. Christ under me, over me, beside me on my left and my right. This day be within and without me, lowly and meek, yet all powerful. Be in the heart of each to whom I speak; in the mouth of each who speaks to me. This day be within me and without me; Christ as a light; Christ as a shield; Christ beside me on my left and my right.

A short act of worship for the Epiphany Season

During Epiphany we celebrate the revealing of the Christ light to the world. As we gather in these uncertain times, we light a candle to remind us that however dark it may seem, God's promise remains true, 'I am with you always, even to the end of time'

A candle is lit (allow yourselves a few moments of quiet reflection)

Lord, touch my lips that I may sing your praise with all my heart

Shine in my soul, O light of the world Come to my aid, O Saviour and Lord

Glory to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit

Mystery of love, behind, through, and beyond all things

I will worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness Praise to you Christ, beloved Son of God

As we turn our faces to you, O God, let our worship be once more a new beginning Cleanse our spirits with your mercy, draw us ever deeper into your love and accept our offering of praise and prayer on behalf of the world through Jesus Christ our brother and our saviour. Amen

May we take quietness with us where ever we go
and exercise care and kindness in all our encounters
