Reading

1 Samuel 3.1-10

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Gospel John 1.43-51

The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, 'Follow me.' Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and said to him, 'We have found him about whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth.' Nathanael said to him. 'Can anything good come out of Nazareth?' Philip said to him, 'Come and see.' When Jesus saw Nathanael coming towards him, he said of him, 'Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!' Nathanael asked him. 'Where did you come to know me?' Jesus answered, 'I saw you under the fig tree before Philip called vou.' Nathanael replied, 'Rabbi. you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!' Jesus answered, 'Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these.' And he said to him, 'Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man.'

Come and See

We hadn't intended to stay up into the early hours of January 7th but we became gripped as well as horrified as we watched the hordes of Trump supporters storm the buildings on Capitol Hill. What was even more alarming was the sight of some of this crowd, once inside, praying for their president to be returned to power. I wondered, what is the nature of their faith? How can the Christianity that I believe in foster so much division and hatred?

When Philip invited Nathanael, in our gospel story, to 'come and see' who Jesus was he did not invite him to witness a faith that was anything like what was being invoked by that vengeful crowd on Capitol Hill. What he invited him to see in Jesus was the grace and mercy of God, bringing light, love, healing and forgiveness into a fragile world darkened by injustice and corruption fostered by Herod's rule, and to believe that by following in the footsteps of this Jesus he could be part of a movement of love that would make the world a better place.

He was inviting him to be part of an unfolding story in which, strengthened by God's love, both he and we can create the conditions in which peace and well-being are not only possible but normal and in which inevitable conflicts can be resolved through justice, kindness, wisdom and love. Today Jesus invites us to 'come and see', to be part of a new story, a story of love rather than hate, of creativity rather than destruction, of cooperation, of peace making and of abundant mercy.
