Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, who in your tender love towards the human race sent your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to take upon him our flesh and to suffer death upon the cross: grant that we may follow the example of his patience and humility, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Reading Isa 50.4-9a

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens— wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backwards. I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. The Lord God helps me; therefore, I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. It is the Lord God who helps me; who will declare me guilty? All of them will wear out like a garment; the moth will eat them up.

Gospel Mark 14.1-15

It was two days before the Passover and the festival of Unleavened Bread. The chief priests and the scribes were looking for a way to arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him; for they said, 'Not during the festival, or there may be a riot among the people.' While he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he sat at the table, a woman came with an alabaster jar of very costly ointment of nard, and she broke open the jar and poured the ointment on his head. But some were there who said to one another in anger, 'Why was the ointment wasted in this way? For this ointment could have been sold for more than three hundred denarii, and the money given to the poor.' And they scolded her. But Jesus said, 'Let her alone; why do you trouble her? She has performed a good service for me. For you always have the poor with you, and you can show kindness to them whenever you wish; but you will not always have me. She has done what she could: she has anointed my body beforehand for its burial. Truly I tell you, wherever the good news is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in remembrance of her.' Then Judas Iscariot, who was one of the twelve, went to the chief priests in order to betray him to them. When they heard it, they were greatly pleased, and promised to give him money. So he began to look for an opportunity to betray him. On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples said to him, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him, and wherever he enters, say to the owner of the house, "The Teacher asks, Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large room upstairs, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there.'

Post Communion

Lord Jesus Christ, you humbled yourself in taking the form of a servant, and in obedience died on the cross for our salvation: give us

the mind to follow you and to proclaim you as Lord and King, to the glory of God the Father.

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Hosanna to the Son of David

We come now to Palm Sunday, to the beginning of Holy Week; a strange Palm Sunday, a strange Holy Week in which we are not able to make the outward, visible and familiar journeys and gestures, exchanges and gatherings that have always accompanied these coming days. There will be no blessing and processing of palm crosses; no singing of 'hosanna, all those things that echo the events of the first Palm Sunday.

However, the priest and prophet Malcolm Guite assures us that all is not lost. 'During these times', he says, 'the inner journey is more necessary than ever. We have the opportunity to explore the truth that what was happening 'out there' and 'back then' as Christ entered Jerusalem, is also happening 'in here' and 'right now'. 'There is', he says, 'a Jerusalem of the heart. Our inner life also has its temples and palaces, its places of corruption, its garden of rest, its seat of judgement.'

So I invite you to walk with Christ and let him walk with you on both an outer and an inner journey that leads to the cross and beyond, and to do so with the words of Malcolm's poem 'Palm Sunday' which you might like to revisit on each of the days of Holy Week.

Now to the gate of my Jerusalem, the seething city of my heart;
The Saviour comes, but will I welcome him?
Oh crowds of easy feelings make a start,
they raise their hands, get caught up in the singing and think the battle won
Too soon they'll find the challenge, the reversal he's bringing changes their tune.
I know what lies behind the surface flourish that so quickly fades;
Self interest and fearful guardedness, the hardness of heart,
it's barricades, and at the core, the dreadful emptiness of a perverted temple
Jesus come, break my resistance and make me your home

We tell your story, we follow in your footsteps; lead us into Holy Week We walk towards the city, we wait in the garden; lead us onto holy ground We journey towards death, we hope for resurrection; lead us into holy joy
